2. Go Digital

Ah, the smell of freshly printed paper...but wait, do we really need all those flyers, pamphlets, and posters? **Save a tree (or two) by using digital resources like contactless business cards, mobile apps, online resources, and digital signage.** Adobe did just that at their 2020 Summit in Las Vegas, where they encouraged attendees to bring their own reusable water bottles and provided refill stations. They also used digital signage and online resources to share event information. And the result? Less paper waste and more digital vibes.

3. Keep it Local

Support your community and reduce your carbon footprint by sourcing ingredients and materials locally. This not only promotes sustainability, but it also helps to reduce waste. Take the 2021 Food for Good Forum in Dubai, for example. The event organizers sourced ingredients for the meals from local farms and vendors, and they even used compostable food containers and utensils made from recycled materials. Yum and eco-friendly? Sign us up!

4. Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

It's the three Rs of sustainability – reduce, reuse, and recycle! By following these three principles, you can significantly reduce your environmental impact. Take a cue from the 2019 Sustainable Brands Conference in Paris, where the event organizers **provided clearly labeled recycling and composting bins.** They also **reused decorations and signage from previous events** and donated leftover food to a local food bank. Now that's what happens when eco minds meet!

5. Spread the Word

Finally, use your event as an opportunity to promote sustainability and educate attendees about environmental issues. By sharing information about sustainable practices and highlighting your own sustainability initiatives, you can inspire others to take action. For the 2020 World Economic Forum in Davos, Switzerland, the event organizers focused on promoting sustainable practices and reducing waste. They used renewable energy sources, provided electric shuttles for transportation, and encouraged attendees to use digital resources instead of printed materials.
